## FAQ FAQ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. Can I drop off my pain medications (narcotics, controlled substances)?
  - A. Yes. We are accepting all residential prescription narcotics.
- Q. Can I drop off liquid or patch prescriptions?
  - A. Yes. We are accepting residential pills, liquids and patches.
- Q. Can I bring my herbal and over-the-counter medications?
  - A. Yes. We are accepting any residential vitamins, herbal remedies, and over-the-counter medications.
- Q. What about injections?
  - A. Yes. We will have sharps containers to collect any unwanted residential injectable medications.
- Q. Can I bring chemicals from under my sink or for my yard?
  - A. No. These products will not be accepted. Please visit www.waukeshacounty.gov/recycling for a location to drop off these products.
- Q. Will I need my ID to prove that I'm from Waukesha County?
  - A. No. While we are limiting the drug collection to Waukesha County citizens, we will not require identification to prove it. However, we will be asking you to complete a short survey to help us with future drug collections.
- Q. Should I take the drugs out of the prescription bottles so my name is not visible?
  - A. No. We will need to verify the drugs on the label and then your name will be removed from the prescription bottle before throwing it out.
- O. How long will the collection take?
  - A. We anticipate a short collection time. Participants will remain in their cars and our volunteers will collect the drugs from you. Depending on the number of participants, it should move smoothly.
- Q. Can someone else bring my medications to the drop off site?
  - A. Yes. Anyone you trust may take the responsibility for bringing your medications to the drop off site.
